Thoughts from the Editor

Well Hello to all of you Ghouls and Goblins!!!

I hope everyone has had a wonderful week and is prepared for our FRIDAY meeting. Please remember to come dressed in your best costume for our Halloween Party. There will be a costume contest and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes will be awarded. Also, I am very excited to hear that we have gained another new member since our Sept meeting. It always makes me very happy to hear that we are continuing to grow.

So, what's the deal with costume wearing, candy seeking children (and adults) who go around knocking on strangers' doors once every October? If you would like an explanation, stay tuned and we'll dig in. Since Halloween is approaching, I thought it would be fun to share some history about this scary yet sweet holiday.

Halloween's roots can be traced all the way back to the 17th-century Celts. Back then the holiday was known as the festival of Samhain which was celebrated October 31st. The Celts believed that the dead returned to earth on that day. Instead of gathering to do the Monster Mash, people gathered to light bonfires, offer sacrifices, and pay homage to the dead. However, during some of these celebrations people would dress in costumes made of animal skins and horns to ward off unwelcome phantom visitors. Banquet tables were set but there were no treats, only tricks. Plates on the table were purposely left empty to placate those unwelcome and evil spirits.

As we pretend to Jazmine with Aladdin on the magic carpet, we fly fast through the centuries and land in 20th century America. Some Irish and Scottish communities revived Old World traditions. However, by the 1920s instead of wearing costumes to ward off ghosts, costumes were used to aid in playing pranks. Pranks had become the activity of choice, especially for rowdy young people. Unfortunately, with the Great Depression mischief was exacerbated and people were being physically assaulted. There is one theory that suggests all of the excessive pranks and random acts of violence on Halloween led to the widespread adoption of community-based trick or treating tradition that was popularized in the 1930s. However, with the outbreak of WW II sugar was being rationed and this meant that there were fewer sweet treats to hand out.

Although down, Halloween traditions were not out. The post war baby boom saw a rise in trick-or-treating. It became a standard of practice for millions of Children in America's cities and newly built suburbs. Candy companies were no longer strained by sugar rationing and stood to capitalize on this holiday. Today Americans spend an avg of 2-3million dollars on candy according to the National Retail Federation and the day itself has become the nation's second-largest commercial holiday. I Hope you enjoyed this mini version of Halloween History and that all of you will enjoy our Halloween meeting/dance which is FRIDAY, OCT 7th.
