The Beginning of a Great Shag Club - Lake Norman Shag Club

At a Spring SOS 1983 a group of friends and newly dedicated Shaggers from Cornelius area spotted a sign: Charleston Shag Club Poolside Party. Curiosity and enthusiasm led them to have the Charleston Shag Club President to send them bylaws and charter, and Mary Robinette and Ron Hager became the official LNSC organizational committee. Soon after, an organizational party was held at the American Legion Building in Cornelius with Chris Beachley as the DJ. The guest list from the party was used to call prospective members and the first organizational meetings were held in the Cornelius Presbyterian Church Hut (yes, a church building, go figure). From the first interest at SOS, then to organizational party, these individuals knew that there MUST be a Shag Club in Cornelius/Lake Norman and the determination was born in 1985 for it to be one of the best Shag Clubs anywhere. There were 16 Charter members: Don (Tootie) & Maxine Brown, Bill Cavin, Peggy Cavin, Jone Coates, Jim Coates, Ron and Martha Hager, Junior and Sarah Little, T. K. and Mary Robinette, Buddy and Sue Rogers, Frank and Jean White.

The LNSC is the one of the oldest and most respected club in the Carolinas Association of Shag Clubs. A perfect example of the impact LNSC has had is our annual Chicken Pickin' Party, the first of which was held at the Mooresville Skating Rink in February 1989. As some of you know the Association conducts for "Workshops" each year in which the business of the Association is conducted. Two of the workshops were conducted at the beach with other two - Summer & Winter - being hosted by the various clubs which bid on them at the Association meetings. Before the LNSC hosted the Winter Workshop in 1989, the Association was having a difficult time try to get clubs to host the workshops. Our club answered the call and bid for the 1989 Winter Workshop and, we were successful. It was not a hard fought campaign. Under the capable leadership of Jackie Duncan, the plans were laid, the party and workshop held (very successfully I might add) and the "Tradition" was born. Our goal was - and still is - to provide a top-quality party at a reasonable price by providing practically everything a party-goer needs: a great dance floor, the best in beach music, excellent food (our famous chicken with all the trimmings and our popular S.O.S. breakfast on Sunday Morning), unlimited beer, soft drinks and vodka drinks for the whole weekend, shuttle service and nice friendly, fun loving people. Our party exceeded all expectations. We continued to bid and host Winter Workshops for the next Five Years; it continued to be very, very successful and grew in popularity. It was our major fund-raiser through the years, helping fund two scholarships we support and other charitable endeavors. We have always believed strongly in our corporate responsibility and proud to say we have given back generously to community. As you might expect, our success did not go unnoticed; it encouraged other clubs to bid to host the Workshops. The Association decided that the Workshop should be rotated around and drew-up boundaries and placed all the clubs within districts. Clubs in a district can only bid on a particular workshop when it is their district's time to host it. However, even though we don't host the workshop each year now, our Chicken' Pickin' still remains one of the premier parties in the Association.
